Position summary: Experienced Jewish educator or outreach professional sought to coordinate innovative domestic violence outreach/education programs. Position based in Peninsula and East Bay, with Bay Area travel required for trainings, outreach and community meetings. This position is responsible for developing and delivering effective outreach campaigns, training and education, and policy development to help the Jewish community effectively prevent and respond to gender-based violence. Utilizing a Jewish educational lens, this includes public speaking, building strategic relationships and campaigns, program planning, working closely with clergy and congregations. Must be familiar with Bay Area Jewish community and able to work effectively with clergy, Jewish professionals, synagogues, community groups and volunteers. Position requires excellent communication & public speaking skills; ability to work both independently and in cooperative, dynamic, small team environment; and a strong commitment to ending violence against women.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Design & implement outreach, training, prevention and education campaigns to prevent gender-based violence within a Jewish framework
- ♦ Coordinate clergy & congregational outreach activities, both Jewish and interfaith
- Plan and coordinate educational events
- Develop/ maintain external relationships with Jewish agencies and community groups
- Represent the organization publicly and respond to requests for speakers and training
- Provide a minimum of 10 domestic violence trainings per year, including
 - o DV assessment, intervention, prevention and best practices for Jewish professionals
 - Interfaith clergy training on faith-based responses to abuse, and Cultural competency training on effective strategies for meeting the needs of Jewish battered women
- Support policy development to prevent abuse in synagogues and other Jewish institutions
- Coordinate Peninsula-based services from our Peninsula office when that re-opens

 Work in collaboration with staff team; attend monthly staff meetings; participate in major agency functions and public events; maintain accurate records and program statistics; perform other duties necessary to the function of agency programs

- 1. Experience in Jewish communal organizing (Jewish education background preferred);
- 2. Knowledge, understanding and/or experience with domestic violence;
- 3. Excellent training and public speaking skills;
- 4. Excellent community organizing skills and ability to work effectively with Jewish communal leaders, professionals and volunteers;
- 5. Ability to create and manage organizational systems;
- 6. Ability to articulate domestic violence prevention messages in a Jewish values framework;
- 7. Ability to work with diverse populations, including a wide range of cultural and religious beliefs, class backgrounds, sexual and gender orientations, ages, and abilities;
- 8. Ability to work both independently and collaboratively;
- 9. Excellent verbal, written, and interpersonal communication skills
- 10. Commitment to the philosophy, mission and vision of the organization
- 11. Desire to work in a small social change organization dedicated to empowering women.

Familiarity with Bay Area Jewish community a plus.

Candidate must be willing to complete 40 hours of domestic violence training or equivalent, in accordance with California state law.
